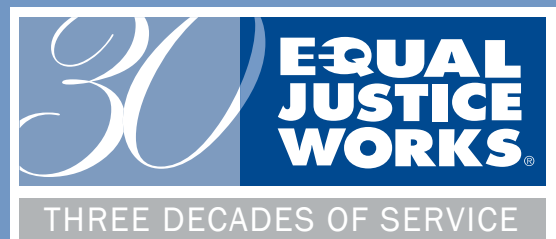

- Table Talk sessions, where you will connect with dozens of employers and learn more about their work.
- Resume and cover letter review, along with mock interviews, to give you immediate feedback as you prepare for the job application process.

Equally important to the workshops and sessions, I encourage you to spend time networking with your peers. Learn about what they are doing in their schools and communities, and consider how you can implement these ideas on your own campus.

I want to thank the faculty and staff from our member law schools who support the public interest aspirations of their students. This event would be impossible without their help.

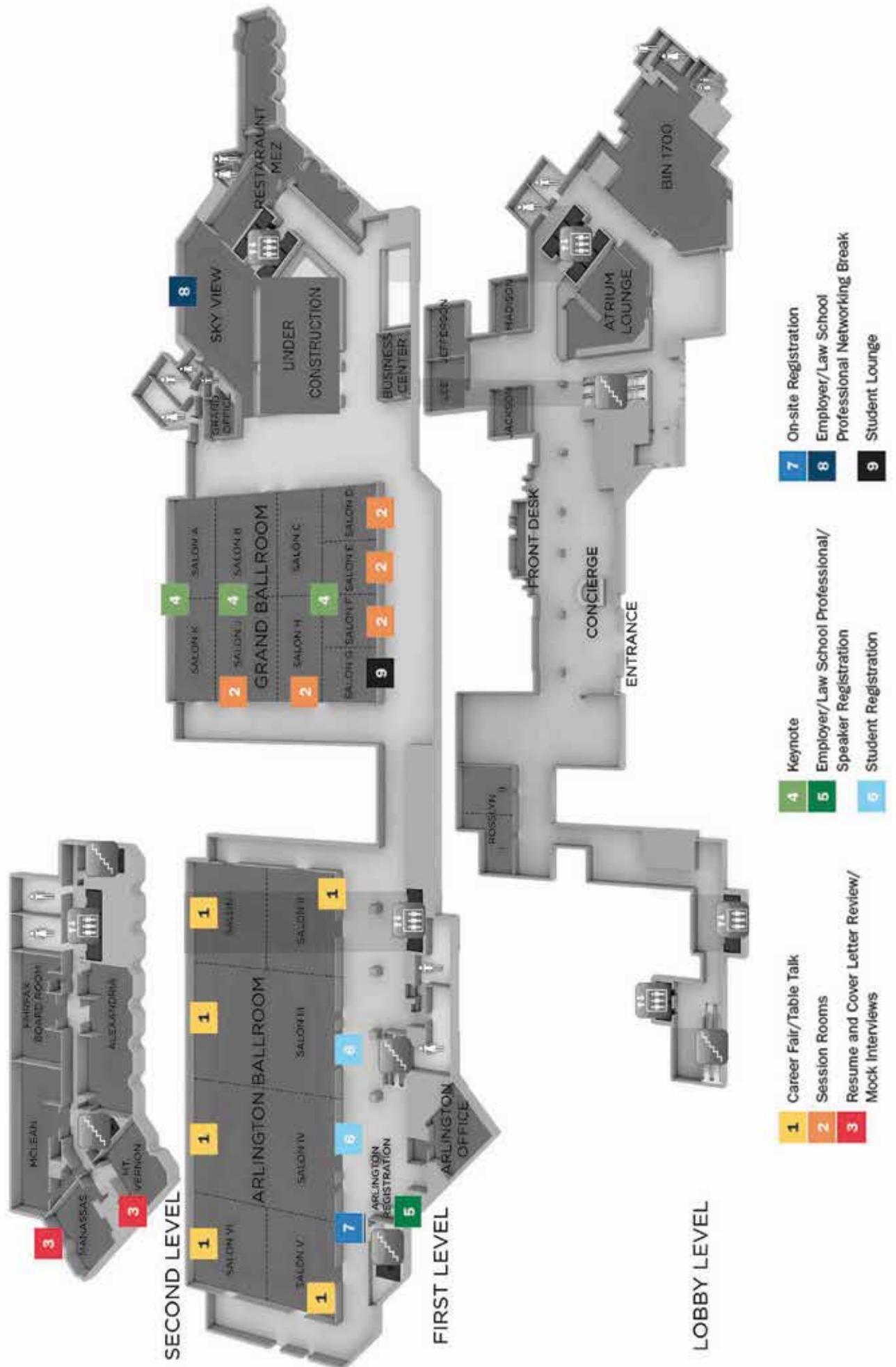
